WHAT IS A CATECHUMEN AND CANDIDATE

Ever wonder what a Catechumen and Candidate is? You will be hearing these terms the next 6 months, and it's always good to expand our vocabulary. So, what is a catechumen and candidate? A catechumen is a person who is inquiring about the Catholic faith, who is unbaptized. A candidate is an inquirer who has been validly baptized in another Christian faith tradition. During this stage of the RCIA participants faith journey, they are just inquiring... think of it as the "dating process", they are getting a sampling of the faith.



As a person completes the period of inquiry, they move into the period of the catechumenate, where they are welcomed to a time of deeper learning, prayer, outreach to those in need and further understanding of our faith community. It is also during this time that each candidate/catechumen chooses or is given a sponsor who assists them in this time of deeper commitment. Please keep all of our RCIA Adults and Teens in your prayers.


